Immersive education in Iceland

Mobile cases for immersive historical education are traveling around the world, and this time, in collaboration with the History Stops Division of the Institute of National Remembrance (IPN), one of these cases visited Iceland. On January 17 and 18, educational workshops were held in Reykjavik for students from the Polish School of John Paul II and the Polish School of January Korczak.
